I have supported legislation to promote an "all of the above" energy solution to ease the pain at the pump.

Advocating for Increased American Oil and Gas Production:

Putting the Gulf of Mexico Back to Work Act -H.R. 1229: Expands domestic oil and gas production in a safe, responsible, and transparent manner by setting firm time-lines for permits.

✓ Passed the House of Representatives on May 11, 2011 – Stalled in the Senate

Protecting Investment in Oil Shale the Next Generation of Environmental, Energy, and Resource Security (PIONEERS) Act - H.R. 3408:

This legislation expands offshore energy production, opens less than three percent of ANWR for oil and natural gas production, encourages the development of oil shale, and approves the Keystone XL pipeline.

✓ Passed the House of Representatives on February 16th, 2012 – Stalled in the U.S. Senate

Fighting to Decrease Domestic Oil and Gas Demand by Expanding Renewable Energy Production

Cutting Red Tape to Facilitate Renewable Energy Act - H.R. 2170:

The bill makes common sense regulatory reforms to accelerate the development of clean, renewable energy projects that create jobs and protect the environment.

✓ Passed the House Natural Resources Committee on November 19th, 2011 – Awaits Action on the House Floor.

Bureau of Reclamation Small Conduit Hydropower Development and Rural Jobs Act of 2012 -H.R. 2842:

This act spurs rural economic development and increases production of clean, renewable hydropower by removing duplicative red tape that already doubles the cost of the hydropower facility and makes development cost-prohibitive.

✓ Passed the House of Representatives on March 7, 2012 – Stalled in the Senate

Removing Regulatory Barriers that Increase Energy Costs

Transparency in Regulatory Analysis of Impacts on the Nation Act of 2011 - H.R. 2401:

The bill forces federal agencies to conduct a comprehensive analysis of regulations before enactment to ensure they do not hamper economic growth and job creation.

✓ Passed the House of Representatives on September 23, 2011 – Stalled in the Senate

Energy Tax Prevention Act of 2011 – H.R. 910:

This legislation prohibits the Environmental Protection Agency from creating high cost, low environmental benefit rules on greenhouse gas emissions.

✓ Passed the House of Representatives on April 7, 2011 – Stalled in the Senate
