A BILL To end COVID-19 lockdowns and COVID-19 vaccine mandates.
1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
This Act may be cited as the "End Lockdowns and
5 Vaccine Mandates Act".
6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
7 The Congress finds the following:
8 (1) States and localities have violated the rights

of American citizens to assemble by refusing them

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1	entry into churches, places of business, and enter-
2	tainment venues.
3	(2) States and localities have restricted the
4	rights of American citizens by denying men and
5	women the ability to earn a living and provide for
6	a family through forced inoculation of the COVID-
7	19 vaccine.
8	SEC. 3. ENDING LOCKDOWNS; ALLOWING THE
9	UNVACCINATED TO PARTICIPATE IN NORMAL
10	LIFE.
11	A State, a political subdivision thereof, and the Fed-
12	eral Government, may not forbid people in the hopes of
13	containing a communicable disease from—
14	(1) entering or remaining in a place of busi-
15	ness, including but not limited to restaurants, movie
16	theaters, stadiums, or concert venues; or
17	(2) opening their places of business or selling
18	goods or services at a physical location.
19	SEC. 4. ENDING VACCINE MANDATES.
20	A State, a political subdivision thereof, or the Federal
21	Government may not—
22	(1) make a condition of employment whether
23	someone has been inoculated with a vaccine; or
24	(2) discriminate in employment, including but
25	not limited to reducing wages, refusing to increase

- 1 wages, or refusing a promotion, based on whether an
- 2 individual has been inoculated or will be inoculated
- with a vaccine.

4 SEC. 5. PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION.

- 5 A citizen of the United States who has experienced
- 6 violations under this Act may assert that violation as a
- 7 claim or defense in a judicial proceeding and obtain appro-
- 8 priate relief against the Federal Government, a State, or
- 9 a locality.

10 SEC. 6. PROHIBITION ON USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS.

- 11 (a) In General.—No Federal funds are authorized
- 12 to be appropriated or otherwise made available to a State
- 13 or political subdivision under any program for which ap-
- 14 propriations are provided on a discretionary basis if the
- 15 head of the Federal department or agency administering
- 16 such program determines that such State or political sub-
- 17 division has violated any provision of this Act.
- 18 (b) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this Act
- 19 may be construed to alter, affect, or otherwise limit any
- 20 Federal payment to which an individual is entitled under
- 21 a provision of law.

22 SEC. 7. SEVERABILITY.

- The provisions of this legislation shall be deemed sev-
- 24 erable and the invalidity or unenforceability of any provi-

- 1 sion shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the
- 2 other provisions hereof.
- 3 SEC. 8. DEFINITION OF A COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.
- 4 In this Act, the term "communicable disease" is a
- 5 disease that can spread from one person to another
- 6 through direct or indirect contact.
