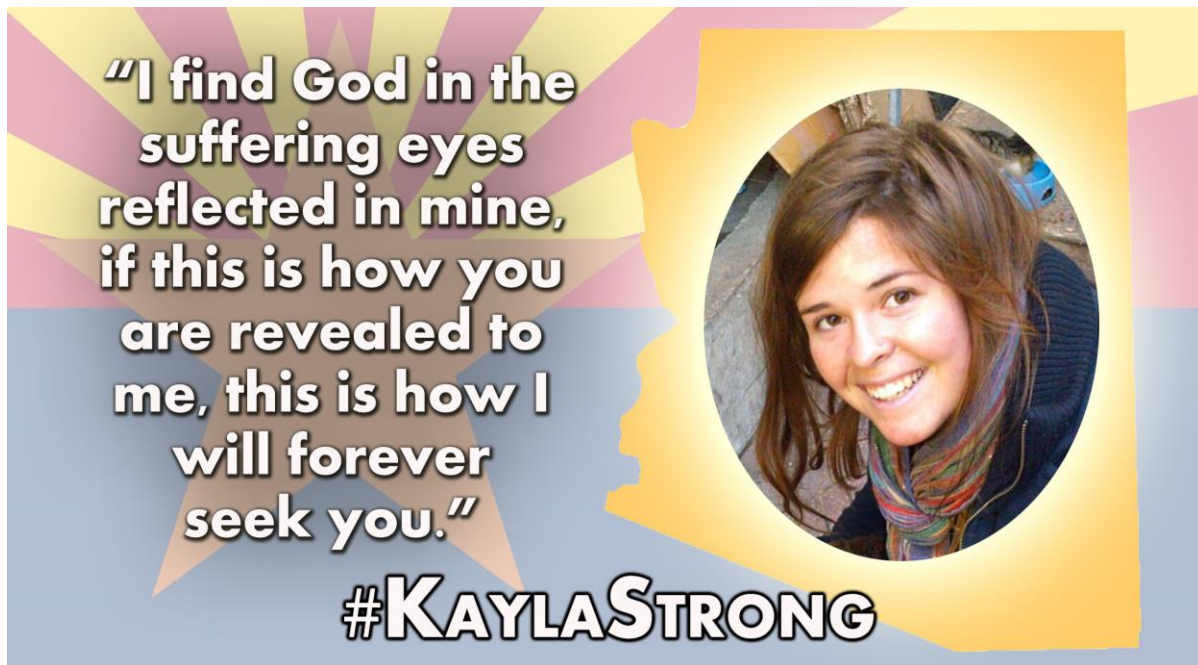
## INVESTIGATING THE FLINT WATER CRISIS

**RULES:**

Students may submit up to 2 entries. Artwork must be original in concept, 2 dimensional and may be up to 28 inches by 28 inches (including the frame) and up to 4 inches in depth. No more than 15 pounds. Artwork may include paintings (oil, acrylics, and watercolor), drawings (pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, and markers), collages, prints (lithographs, silkscreen, and block prints), mixed media, computer generated art or photography.
