Bat-Sheva Hayat presented me with a poster to hang in my office, showing her son fighting the 2010 Mount Carmel fire before it engulfed the bus, full with 37 passengers, as well as her son.

Avoiding Another Tragedy

In the wake of the tragic Yarnell Hill Fire, we must pass legislation that facilitates

wildfire prevention. In March, I introduced the <u>Catastrophic Wildfire Prevention Act of 2013</u>, which aims to prevent destructive wildfires and stimulate rural economies. Specifically, the legislation renews and reforms the Forest Service's ability to partner with private industry and local governments to implement thinning and ecological restoration projects.

The bill provides the federal government with the tools and the expedited processes to proactively treat our forests, improve public safety and put people back to work. We must avoid future losses, both in life and property, due to preventable fires; Congress must act now.

This week, the House Natural resources committee, of which I'm a member, held a hearing on wildfire prevention. I urged my colleagues to act swiftly on passing a bill that could prevent future catastrophic wildfires. Read more from the *Arizona Capitol Times* HERE.

Gang of 8 Immigration Bill Passes The Senate

The Senate passed, what I consider to be, one of the worst bills I have seen since Obamacare. Riddled with pork, rewarding law breakers and making false promises, I cannot support this bill. I told the Wall Street Journal this as well, in an article HERE.

As I stated before, I do support reforming our skilled and unskilled labor visa programs. Our farmers in Yuma desperately need a system that provides reliable labor. I intend to get them that reform. Getting Our Priorities Right

On Wednesday, the House passed the Energy and Water Appropriations Act. As elected officials, we have a responsibility to make the tough decisions to cut spending while prioritizing and preserving our most vital programs. Passage of the Energy and Water Appropriations Act accomplishes just that.

The Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act included an amendment I introduced. This amendment would prohibit the Department of Energy from implementing the "Chu Memorandum." Issued by former Secretary of Energy Steven Chu in 2012, the "Chu Memorandum" outlines four specific directives that could increase energy costs dramatically. By voting for the FARRM Act, I voted for real reform and against the status quo of big government spending. For the first time in decades, the new farm bill removes food stamps from agricultural policy. As a conservative, I am proud to see the free-market reforms implemented because of this bill..


