# A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the Granite Mountain Hotshots who fought the Yarnell Hill Fire, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Granite Mountain Hot-
- 5 shots Commemorative Coin Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) "Hotshots" are elite firefighters that spe-
2	cialize in the containment of wildfire.
3	(2) On June 28, 2013, lighting ignited the
4	Yarnell Hill Fire on a ridge west of Yarnell, Ari-
5	zona, and the fire spread rapidly.
6	(3) Firefighters from the Granite Mountain
7	Interagency Hotshot Crew (hereafter in this Act re-
8	ferred to as the "Granite Mountain Hotshots"), a
9	crew within the Prescott Fire Department, were de-
10	ployed to assist with the containment of the Yarnell
11	Hill Fire.
12	(4) On June 30, 2013, 19 firefighters from the
13	Granite Mountain Hotshots perished while attempt-
14	ing to contain the Yarnell Hill Fire and preserve the
15	lives and livelihoods of the residents of Yarnell. The
16	19 firefighters were—
17	(A) Andrew Ashcraft, age 29;
18	(B) Robert Caldwell, age 23;
19	(C) Travis Carter, age 31;
20	(D) Dustin Deford, age 24;
21	(E) Christopher MacKenzie, age 30;

11	(5) Of the 20 Granite Mountain Hotshots fight-
12	ing the Yarnell Hill Fire, only the lookout, Brendan
13	McDonough, survived. Brendan McDonough is now
14	a motivational speaker who honors the legacy of the
15	19 fallen Granite Mountain Hotshots.
16	(6) The Yarnell Hill Fire was the deadliest
17	wildfire in the history of the state of Arizona. The
18	Yarnell Hill Fire was the deadliest wildland fire in
19	the United States for firefighters since the year
20	1933 and the third deadliest wildfire in the history
21	of the United States. The Yarnell Hill Fire resulted
22	in more firefighter deaths in the United States than
23	any single occurrence since the September 11, 2001,
24	terrorist attacks.

1	(7) Every year, on June 30, residents of
2	Yarnell honor the Granite Mountain Hotshots.
3	(8) The Granite Mountain Hotshots Memorial
4	State Park, located on the site of the Yarnell Hill
5	Fire, was dedicated to the Granite Mountain Hot-
6	shots in the year 2016.
7	SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
8	(a) DENOMINATION.—The Secretary of the Treasury
9	(hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary") shall
10	mint and issue the following coin:
11	(1) $5$ GOLD COINS.—Not more than 50,000 $5$

4 (b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this
5 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
6 title 31, United States Code.

7 (c) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of sections
8 5134 and 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all coins
9 minted under this Act shall be considered to be numis10 matic items.

### 11 SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS.

12 (a) DESIGN REQUIREMENTS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The designs of the coins
minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the
fight of the Granite Mountain Hotshots against the
Yarnell Hill Fire in the year 2013.

17 (2) NUMBER OF DESIGNS.—The Secretary shall
18 mint and issue 20 distinct designs under this Act,
19 each of which will honor a different firefighter of the
20 Granite Mountain Hotshots who fought the Yarnell
21 Hill Fire on June 30, 2013, by including on one side
22 the name and likeness of such firefighter.

23 (3) DESIGNATION AND INSCRIPTIONS.—On
24 each coin minted under this Act, there shall be—

25 (A) a designation of the value of the coin;

1	(B) an inscription of the year "2023"; and
2	(C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
3	"In God We Trust", "United States of Amer-
4	ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".
5	(b) SELECTION.—The design for the coins minted
6	under this Act shall be—
7	(1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
8	with the Commission of Fine Arts; and
9	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory
10	Committee.
11	SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.
12	(a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
13	Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
14	(b) Period for Issuance.—The Secretary may
15	issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year
16	period beginning on January 1, 2023.
17	SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.
18	(a) SALE PRICE.—The coins issued under this Act
19	shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
20	of—
21	(1) the face value of the coins;
22	(2) the surcharge provided in section 7(a) with
23	respect to such coins; and

1 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins 2 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, 3 overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping). 4 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable 5 6 discount. 7 (c) PREPAID ORDERS.— 8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept 9 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act 10 before the issuance of such coins. 11 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-12 paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea-13 sonable discount. 14 SEC. 7. SURCHARGES. 15 (a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins issued under this Act shall include a surcharge of— 16 17 (1) \$35 per coin for the \$5 coin; 18 (2) 10 per coin for the 1 coin; and 19 (3) \$5 per coin for the half-dollar coin. 20 (b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f) of 21 title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by 22 the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act 23 shall be promptly paid to the Yarnell Fire District for the 24 purpose of wildfire prevention and wildfire education.

(c) AUDITS.—The recipient of surcharges under this
 Act shall be subject to the audit requirements of section
 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United States Code, with regard
 to the amounts received under subsection (b).

5 (d) LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding subsection (a), no surcharge may be included with respect to the issuance 6 under this Act of any coin during a calendar year if, as 7 8 of the time of such issuance, the issuance of such coin 9 would result in the number of commemorative coin pro-10 grams issued during such year to exceed the annual 2 commemorative coin program issuance limitation under 11 12 section 5112(m)(1) of title 31, United States Code (as in 13 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act). The Secretary may issue guidance to carry out this subsection. 14

## 15 SEC. 8. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

16 The Secretary shall take such actions as may be nec-17 essary to ensure that—

(1) minting and issuing coins under this Act
will not result in any net cost to the United States
Government; and

(2) no funds, including applicable surcharges,
shall be disbursed to any recipient designated in section 6 until the total cost of designing and issuing
all of the coins authorized by this Act (including
labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, overhead ex-

1 penses, marketing, and shipping) is recovered by the

2 United States Treasury, consistent with sections

- 3 5112(m) and 5134(f) of title 31, United States
- 4 Code.
